Today's Gospel Reflection

1st Reading: 1 Kgs 19:16b, 19-21 * Psalm: Ps 16:1-2, 5, 7-11 *
2nd Reading: Gal 5:1, 13-18 * Gospel: Lk 9:51-62

DISCIPLESHIP'S COSTS

In today's first reading, God tells the prophet Elijah to prepare Elisha to succeed him. Succeeding Elijah will be no easy task; he has spent his life facing threats from the kings he has confronted about their infidelity to the God of Israel. The psalm illustrates the emotional and spiritual distress that the prophets' steadfast faithfulness to God brought them. Paul's description of the Christian's freedom from the law as opposed to "the desire of the flesh" puts this struggle at the very heart of Christian identity. The reading from Luke's Gospel recounts Jesus' decision to journey toward Jerusalem, where he knows he will meet his earthly fate. Following Jesus—like succeeding Elijah as prophet—will now become more difficult. Unlike his calls to the first disciples, Jesus encounters those who are not ready or are not strong enough to journey with him.

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nets, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head." - Luke 9:58

CALLED BY GOD

We return to Ordinary Time this Sunday, and with this new season we focus on what it means to be a person who is called by God for some definite purpose. Elisha recognized God's call in Elijah's greeting and prepared immediately to follow. The people who came to Jesus seemed ready to follow, yet each had reasons to linger behind. As people who are given the freedom to follow or to stay behind, we must ask ourselves what we are ready to do for the sake of Christ and the call of the gospel. What are you called to do at this time in your life? Are you prepared to leave behind the things that get in the way of living as a Christian?

FOLLOW

What does it mean to follow Jesus? The Gospels show us that Jesus called each person individually, recognizing the things that stood in the way for each. He looked into the person's heart and saw the true desires of the person standing before him. Each of us experiences Christ's call uniquely as the persons we are. For some, following requires us to take stock of our lives and let go of the obstacles that keep us from the way of true discipleship. For others, the call may lead us to deepen the way that faith directs our lives, with more intentional time in prayer, regular participation in Mass, renewed attention to family, involvement in our parish, or new acts of service.

BE READY

It is easy to say we want to follow Jesus, yet most of us feel competing desires that stand in the way of discipleship. We may be distracted by the constant swirl of activity so prevalent in our surrounding culture; we might be lured by worldly wealth and the status that often accompanies it; we may simply be comfortable with the way things are and find it difficult to risk changing anything. In today's Gospel, Jesus makes it clear that we must stop putting off making the changes that will bring us closer to him and to God's way of life. We must trust in the Lord, knowing that what he most deeply desires is that we be close to him. If you encountered Jesus today and said you were ready to follow him, what would he see in your heart, what obstacles or hesitations would he perceive? Go to Jesus in prayer this day. Listen to him say, "Follow me." Prayerfully place your life in the Lord's hands and be ready to follow.

Dear Parishioners and friends,

It is with a joyful heart that I introduce to you the new member of the Clergy of St. Michael Parish — **Deacon Jaime “Jim” Roque.**

Jim has been a registered parishioner of St. Michael Parish since 1987, but he wasn't an active member for a long time and not many parishioners knew him.

In late 2015, tragedy struck. Doctors said that his wife, Corazon nee Arasula, might have as little as three weeks to live. He prayed that God give her more time so he can take care of her. Jim and Cora were married for 33 years and have one daughter.

God answered his prayers and granted him another 13 months to be with her, and he said, *“That extension wasn't for her. It was for me to get to know Him better.”*

Jim began saying “yes” to the invitation to get more involved in the parish. He served as sacristan, lector, and extraordinary minister of Holy Communion. He also participated in the Home Evangelization Program of the Apostles of Divine Mercy of St. Michael. *“The church became my second home, serving in four or five Masses every Sunday”*, he said.

Jim was a veteran of the U.S. Navy and later a civilian employee for the Navy, and retired in early 2020.

When Jim was asked to consider the diaconate, he did not hesitate and said yes. *“I can say that I wasn't really close to God (earlier in life), but I was so blessed because He did not give up in calling me to serve him.”*

Jim will be assisting at all Masses this weekend. Meet and greet him after Mass and together **let us welcome Deacon Jim Roque.**

Reflexiones del Evangelio

EL VALOR DEL DISCIPULADO

En la primera lectura de hoy, Dios le dice al profeta Elías que prepare a Eliseo para que sea su sucesor. Ser sucesor de Elías no será una tarea fácil, él ha pasado su vida enfrentado las amenazas de los reyes a los que ha confrontado por sus infidelidades al Dios de Israel. El salmo ilustra la angustia emocional y espiritual que la firme fidelidad de los profetas a Dios les produjo. La descripción de Pablo de la libertad del cristiano frente a la ley en contraposición al “deseo de la carne” pone esta lucha en el corazón mismo de la identidad cristiana. La lectura del Evangelio de Lucas relata la decisión de Jesús de viajar a Jerusalén, donde él sabe que encontrará su destino terrenal. Seguir a Jesús, así como suceder a Elías como profeta, será menos fácil. A diferencia de sus llamadas a los primeros discípulos, Jesús se encuentra con aquellos que no están preparados o no son lo suficientemente fuertes para viajar con él.

STEWARDSHIP SAINT for JUNE

Saint Barnabas

Barnabas comes as close as anyone outside the twelve apostles to being considered an apostle. He is memorialized, in part, for his amazing evangelizing ministry. He was a Jew from Cyprus named Joseph but the apostles affectionately nicknamed him “Barnabas,” which means “son of encouragement.” When he became a follower of Jesus he sold some of his property and donated the proceeds to the apostles (Acts 4:36-37).

Most of what we know about Barnabas is found in the Acts of the Apostles. He befriends Saul (Paul), brings him to the apostles and a very suspicious Jewish community in Jerusalem, and describes for them how on the road Paul had seen the Lord and how in Damascus he had spoken boldly in the name of Jesus (Acts 9:27).

When a Christian community begins to form in Antioch, Syria, Barnabas is sent as the official emissary of the church of Jerusalem to catechize its members. Barnabas and Paul taught there for a year, after which they took collections back to Jerusalem. Later Barnabas and Paul, now seen as charismatic leaders, are sent by the Antioch community to preach to the Gentiles where they enjoyed such enormous success that the people even wanted to offer sacrifice to them as gods.

Barnabas and Paul would attend the assembly in Jerusalem that settled the question of circumcision for Gentile converts (Acts 15; Gal. 2:1-10). Barnabas supported the Gentile Christians who did not see why they should have to be circumcised and observe Jewish dietary laws. The council decided in their favor. When Paul stood up to Peter for not eating with Gentiles for fear of his Jewish friends, he wrote that “even Barnabas was carried away by their hypocrisy” (see Galatians 2:1-13). And **even after disagreements caused Paul and Barnabas to part ways for a time, Paul continued to use Barnabas as an example of apostolic behavior** (1 Cor. 9:6).

Barnabas is the patron saint of Cyprus. It was there that he established its first Christian community. It was also there, in the Greco-Roman city of Salamis that, according to tradition, he was stoned to death around the year 60. His remains were taken to Constantinople, where a church was built in his honor.

Saint Barnabas is heralded as having a single-minded devotion to Jesus Christ. In Acts 11:24, it is written that he was a man “filled with the Holy Spirit and faith” whose ministry insured that “large numbers were added to the Lord.”

His instructions may seem harsh and unreasonable to our ears. His response to legitimate requests to postpone the journey reminds us that there are always justifiable excuses to defer the journey or put off the responsibilities of discipleship. Other important matters compete for our attention. Some of us must make heart-wrenching choices, but there is urgency about Jesus' mission to bring forth God's kingdom. His demand is that we proclaim the Kingdom of God now. Is this our first priority, or do we have other priorities?

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time "Laws of Love"

St. Paul has a unique vision of freedom. We often think that freedom means I can do what I want without interference from an outside source, such as a bureaucracy or a dictator. For Paul, freedom is not so much being free from oppression as being free to love and serve those around us.

What would stop us from loving others? It could be fear: "I'm not sure I would be able to do any good. I'm afraid of going into a bad neighborhood to help the homeless." Or it could be attachment to possessions or even to our family—the man in the Gospel wasn't free to follow Jesus because he thought it meant leaving his family behind.

Paul talks about another kind of freedom when he says that following the Spirit means freedom from the Law (Galatians 5:18). He meant people who were obsessed with keeping all the laws and customs that were part of the Jewish tradition. Taken to an extreme, you would have to memorize every law on the books to be sure you did not break one. The freedom of the Spirit is a life lived out of love. As long as we love one another, we wouldn't have to worry about breaking the law, for God's laws are all examples of how to love one another.

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TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The pilgrim experience of going by foot to Santiago de Compostella, the shrine of St. James, reaches its high point a month from now at the feast of the Apostle. By now, tens of thousands of pilgrims are already on the road. Typically, they cover twelve to twenty miles a day through rough territory. The difficult journey and the often primitive lodging facilities are made bearable by the joy of the pilgrims, their songs and prayers. When their journey is documented properly, they receive the scallop shell, a reminder not only of James the fisherman, but also his call to fish for human beings and to baptize the nations. In the Middle Ages, those who wore this badge on their hats were granted lodging and hospitality wherever they went. Next to the palm, the sign of a Jerusalem pilgrim, the scallop shell was most highly prized.

In the Middle Ages, some people so enjoyed the pilgrim road, although it was filled with discomfort and danger, that they spent most of their lives on the road. Today, some people take up the route for exercise, but are drawn gradually into the spirituality of the journey. As you make your summer travels, always fold in an element of pilgrimage: a long walk through beautiful countryside, a visit to a church, a prayer of gratitude for your journey through life's hills and valleys.
